

# 150<sup>th</sup> Twigg's Surrender SUVCW Sesquicentennial Signature Event



Greetings Department of Texas SUVCW Brothers and Federal reenactors. On February 12, 2011 we invite you to join us for the Sesquicentennial anniversary for this annual event on Alamo Plaza, San Antonio, Texas. We have two shows: 11 AM and 2 PM in front of The Alamo. We invite you to bring your family and make a day of it. Public parking fee lot is located behind the Alamo or other nearby public lots. This looks to be a huge event with hundreds of reenactors. Get there early.

This is a uniformed event. Please strive for pre-war frock coat, Hardee hat, and dark blue trousers. Although we do see the sky blue kersey trousers with sack coat and bumper cap out there.

- This is a non-shooting event no caps or powder will be allowed on the Alamo grounds.
- All participants must register on site. Period weapons will be inspected and tagged.
- All SUVCW civilians are welcome to participate off the field and work the SUVCW recruiting and education tables. Period dress or sport coat and tie please. Wear your Membership Medal.
- Cost for the event will be \$10.00 paid at on site registration, bring cash. This will help cover all insurance, permits and off duty police officers.
- Camp 18 will be taking advanced requests for our Commemorative Sesquicentennial Medal for a minimum donation of \$10 each. We are hoping the medals arrive in time but are not sure they will. Proceeds of the medal to assist in the Camp's educational efforts including graves registration and monument repair.
- Regional media coverage has been organized and there are hundreds of spectators on hand.
- We Federals are an occupying force and hold fast before surrendering and marching off the Alamo grounds with colors and weapons held high.
- Please gather in front of the Alamo at 8 – 8:30 AM, get registered, weapons inspected and check in at the SUVCW table. It takes a while to get all the ranks organized and staged so plan accordingly. Each show is about 40 minutes in length. Following the first show most of the participants amble to nearby establishments, set muskets and swords against the wall and take refreshment and fellowship until 1 PM to then rally for the 2 PM show which seems to go a lot smoother.
